From 1 July 2021, the electoral register in Northern Ireland will be renewed as part of the national canvass. If you want to vote you must register, even if you have registered before. You'll be asked for your National Insurance number (but you can still register if you do not have one). After you've registered, your name and address will appear on the electoral register. There's a different process to register anonymously. Check if you're already registered Contact your local Electoral Registration Office to find out if you're already registered to vote.
