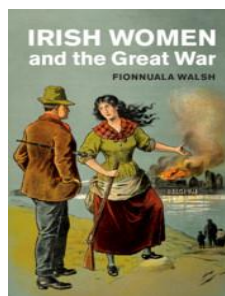
### Good Relations Week – Thank you

### Rural Shared History Project – 100 Years of Change



RCN is pleased to announce that it has secured an evening with Dr Fionnuala Walsh (first of the series of six) starting **Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2021 at 7pm.**

This talk shows the impact of the Great War on women's everyday lives in Ireland, focusing on the years of the war and the immediate aftermath. Irish women threw themselves into the war effort, mobilising in various forms, such as nursing wounded soldiers, preparing hospital supplies and producing weapons of war. Dr Walsh will bring women's wartime experiences out of history's shadow as she examines welfare, domestic life, bereavement and employment, and reflects upon the significant impact of the Great War on Irish society.

### Rural Micro Capital Grant Scheme 2021



This Scheme is funded under the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs Tackling Rural Poverty and Social Isolation Programme and is being delivered

by the Rural Support Networks and closes for applications at **12 noon on Friday 22nd October 2021**.

Micro Capital grants of **between £200 and £1,500** are available to rural community-led, voluntary organisations for projects tackling issues of local poverty and/or social isolation. The total project cost **must not exceed £3,000**.

Projects must clearly address an issue of rural poverty and/or social isolation and applicants **must provide a minimum of 15% match funding**.

Projects must focus on one of the following three themes:

- o Modernisation (of premises/assets)
- o Information Communication Technology (ICT)
- o Health and Wellbeing

### RCN 5G New Thinking project apply for our 3 study visits

Following our 2 recent events on digital connectivity – which looked at connecting rural “not spots” and remote working hubs respectively, we are pleased to invite applications for participation in 3 forthcoming study visits

Applications are invited from people working in a paid or voluntary capacity in rural community development and/or policy within the statutory or VCSE (voluntary, community, social enterprise) sector. Each of the fully funded study visits will have a limited number of places and be dependent on the prevailing Coronavirus pandemic health protection regulations.

In November 2021, with support of the [Western Development Commission](#) we will look at the development of rural hubs in the west of Ireland and the role of the [National Hubs Network](#)

In January 2022, in association with the [Scotland 5G Centre](#) we will visit the [Crichton](#), a campus in Dumfries, which is hosting Scotland’s first rural 5G hub and also visit a rural area at Loch Lomond to learn how better connectivity has been provided.

Finally, in spring 2022 we hope to visit [Mobile Access North Yorkshire project](#) and the [5G Connected Forest](#) project at Sherwood Forest.
