

Diploma in Community Development Practice

The Diploma in Community Development Practice is a one-year (part time) course accredited by the University of Galway, which will be held in **2 locations** this year.

The Diploma in Community Development Practice has been designed to enable Community Activists (volunteers and paid staff in the community / voluntary sector) to develop the knowledge, understanding and essential practical skills and experience required to provide leadership within this field.

One off cost of £150 per person. If you are unwaged then we can talk to you about how we can support you to meet this payment.

Places are limited to 25 students.
