#### **Rural Residents' Forum Site Visit**

Members of the Rural Residents' Forum took part in a recent site visit hosted by Positive
Carrickfergus. Positive Carrickfergus are a community interest company led by people who live and work in the town and surrounding area. They have developed several initiatives focused on community ownership and community economic development. Their work has included instigating the Carrick Greengrocers which is a co-operative enterprise, owned and operated by its members selling fresh fruit, vegetables and other locally produced foods to the local community. We were hosted on the day by Lee Robb who gave us a tour of the town centre and spoke about their work to date and future plans.
